A few comments:

Art III Sec 22 – I suggest we state that in addition to a signature, the signer is to print their name, their address and the date. I notice “his” is the only gender pronoun used here. Art II Sec 6 uses “his or her” and “his/her.” These were amended after women received the vote and I expect that is why they are used. Suggest a “find & replace” to assure male and female are used throughout the entire Charter.

Art III Sec 26 – The second and third options might better withstand any challenge, and additionally the third option might also better avoid the cost of a special election.

Art I Sec 2 D. – Have we already or will we also change Sec 3 [and any other place referenced] to reflect the City Manager is the CEO?

General comments – Suggest all petitions require the signer to also print their name, address and the date of signing. A question regarding Sec 55 & 56: Is the City Attorney also the Municipal Court Prosecuting Attorney?
