**Instructions to Voter**

- **To vote:** completely darken the oval (●) to the left of your choice.
- Note the permitted number of choices directly below the title of each candidate office. Do not mark the ballot for more choices than allowed.
- If you mark the ballot for more choices than permitted, that contest or question will not be counted.
- **To vote for a write-in candidate:** completely darken the oval (●) to the left of the blank line and write in the candidate's name. Only votes cast for candidates who filed as write-in candidates can be counted.
- Do not write in a candidate's name if that person's name already is printed on the ballot for that same contest.
- **If you make a mistake or want to change your vote:** return your ballot to an election official and get a new ballot. You may ask for a new ballot up to two times.





<p><b>For County Auditor</b> (Vote for not more than 1)</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Karl Keith</p>	<p><b>Issue 1</b> Creates a bipartisan, public process for drawing congressional districts <b>Proposed Constitutional Amendment</b> Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly To amend the version of Section 1 of Article XI that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2021, and to enact Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Article XIX of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to establish a process for congressional redistricting. A majority yes vote is necessary for the amendment to pass.</p>

<p><b>For Member of County Central Committee</b> (Vote for not more than 1)</p> <p><input type="radio"/> David Esrati <input type="radio"/> Kriss Gang <input type="radio"/> Savannah Webb</p>	<p><b>Issue 1</b> The proposed amendment would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>End the partisan process for drawing congressional districts, and replace it with a process with the goals of promoting bipartisanship, keeping local communities together, and having district boundaries that are more compact.</li><li>Ensure a transparent process by requiring public hearings and allowing public submission of proposed plans.</li><li>Require the General Assembly or the Ohio Redistricting Commission to adopt new congressional districts by a bipartisan vote for the plan to be effective for the full 10-year period.</li><li>Require that if a plan is adopted by the General Assembly without significant bipartisan support, it cannot be effective for the entire 10-year period and must comply with explicit anti-gerrymandering requirements.</li></ul> <p>If passed, the amendment will become effective immediately.</p> <p><b>SHALL THE AMENDMENT BE APPROVED?</b></p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES <input type="radio"/> NO</p>
